- John 17:17


"Prior Planning Prevents Poor Performance."

This time-tested classic was refreshed with a 2003 edition revised by Alistair Begg and published by Crossway. Each day




features a short Scripture text, and a meditation on that text like only Spurgeon (the 19th Century "Prince of Preachers") could produce. This is



HOW FAITHFUL CHRISTIAN LIVING IMITATES THE INCARNATION

From Pastor Myers

Christmas celebrates a stunning reality. The Divine Son of God, Second Person of the Holy Trinity, has taken to Himself a true human nature. The Word who was with God and was God (John 1.1) has become flesh (John 1.14). Without in the least being stained by sin, and without his divine and human natures being in the least confused, changed, divided or separated, Jesus Christ has entered our world of frailty, weakness, pain and death in order to become our perfect and sympathetic High Priest (Heb 4:15). And he has commissioned every Christian to spread the aroma of such love and grace that is constitutive of his character as well(2 Cor 2.15). In that sense, every Christian is a minister (Eph 4.12)

Ministry is a glorious privilege. We have an infinitely rich treasure which we get to give to a desperately poor world. We have a glorious light with which to shine in a bleakly dark world. It is nothing less than the life and power of Christ in his resurrection that we give.

But the way in which we give this treasure in this life does not imitate Christ's glorified state. It imitates Christ's incarnation and his passion.

We do not have this treasure in golden chests. Instead as we read in 2 Corinthians 4.7, we have this treasure in jars of clay.

What is the experience of Christian ministry?

It is the experience of carrying a priceless commodity in an ordinary container (much like a man who is also a God-man). It is the experience of carrying treasure in jars of clay.

Scholars inform us that these jars that Paul refers to were not expensive. They were actually quite cheap and fragile. They were weak and breakable, kill-able we might say. And as Jesus Christ became human in order to die (Mark 10:45), so

too have non-Christians become Christians in order to die (Matt 16.24-25). The incarnation is an event that cannot be fully understood apart from the shadow of the cross that hangs over it.

Paul continues to develop the strength-in weakness theme, the anti-triumphalism thrust of Christian ministry in v.8-10 of 2 Cor 4:

"We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed, always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be manifested in our bodies."

This is the experience of Christian ministry in this life. It is the experience of weakness and suffering.

The faithful sufferings of Christians do not hide the glory of Christ. They showcase the glory of Christ. For we do not serve a God we make inferences about and reason up towards from nature. We serve a God who has revealed Himself to us.

And has not just revealed Himself in nature but also without nature, above nature and even against nature. We worship a God who has revealed Himself most fully not in the form of a luxurious King, but in the form of a servant who was born in a manger and would go on to die an ignominious death for sinners.

This is the experience of Christian ministry. As God saw, so he sent. And as God sent, so we share. We work life in others while carrying death in ourselves. It's as Paul says in v.12 "death is at work in us, but life is at work in you."

This brings glory to God, because it demonstrates that the surpassing power for salvation belongs to God and not to man. This is how all Christians in their walk with God and in their service to others imitate the incarnation.


